- * April is a month to celebrate those who have received transplants, to raise awareness for those who continue to wait, to honor the donors and their families, and to thank those who are registered donors for giving hope
- * In 2018, more than 36,500 transplants brought renewed life to recipients & their families
- * More than 110,000 men, women and children are waiting for organ transplants
- * Every 10 minutes another name is added to the list
- * One donor can save up to 8 lives, give sight to 2 people, and heal 75 others
- * People of all ages and medical histories can potentially be donors. At the time of your death, the doctors will determine what organs and tissues can be donated
- * Living donors must be in good health, both mentally and physically, and older than 18 years of age. Approval is only given after a full medical evaluation is completed
- * All major religions support organ donation!!!!
- * Donation is only considered when a patient is declared clinically & legally dead
- * There is no cost incurred by the donor family
- * Many people are in favor of donation but forget to register and let their families
- * know of their wishes to be an organ donor
